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Note for leaders

We recommend group members read the questions before viewing each session, as it may be helpful for them to write in their answers as they watch.

5. Scripture states that God will wipe away all of our tears (Revelation 21:4). What did Randy suggest instead of there being a "memory wipe" (not remembering things that would cause us to cry)? Did you find comfort in this idea?

4. Were your ideas about eternal rewards challenged? State some verses shared in this lesson that proclaim the importance of eternal rewards and how they differ from what is required for salvation.

5. How accurate is it to say: “This world is not our home”? Have you ever considered this statement to be true? Do you still see it the same way?

3. What do you learn from Romans 8 about the resurrection of man and animals?

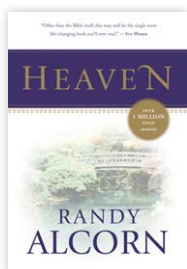

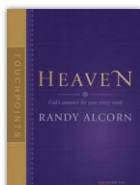

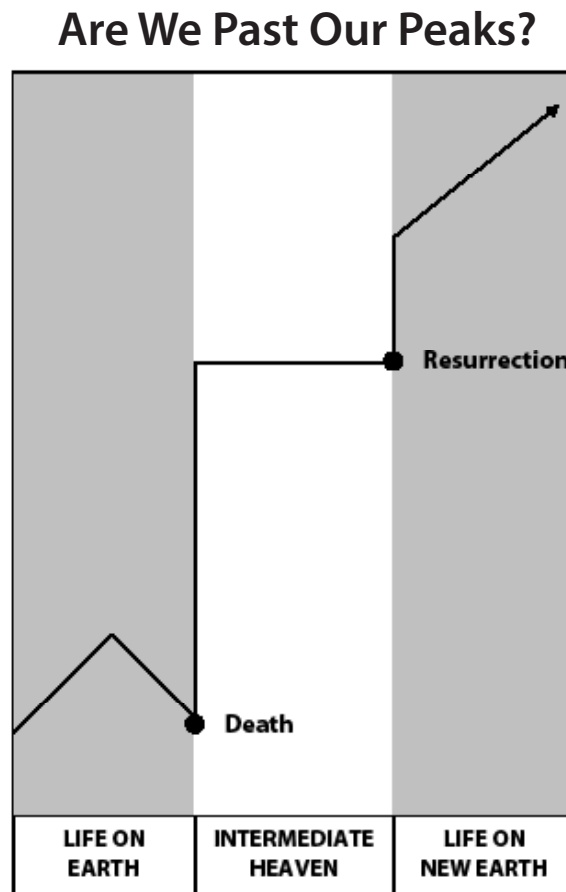
